i-graduate and the Student Barometer™

The Student Barometer™ (SB) is the global benchmark for the student experience now with feedback from 2.3 million students. The semi-standardised survey measures all aspects of the student experience: arrival, learning, living and support services, as well as prospective student decision-making and intentions. Students across all years and all levels of study are included in this annual survey. Results are delivered in interact™, a data visualisation tool, enabling data to be filtered by study area, department, demographics, and study level, mode and type. All results are confidential and unpublished and reported to institutions in person. Results are used by institutions to make informed decisions to enhance the student experience.

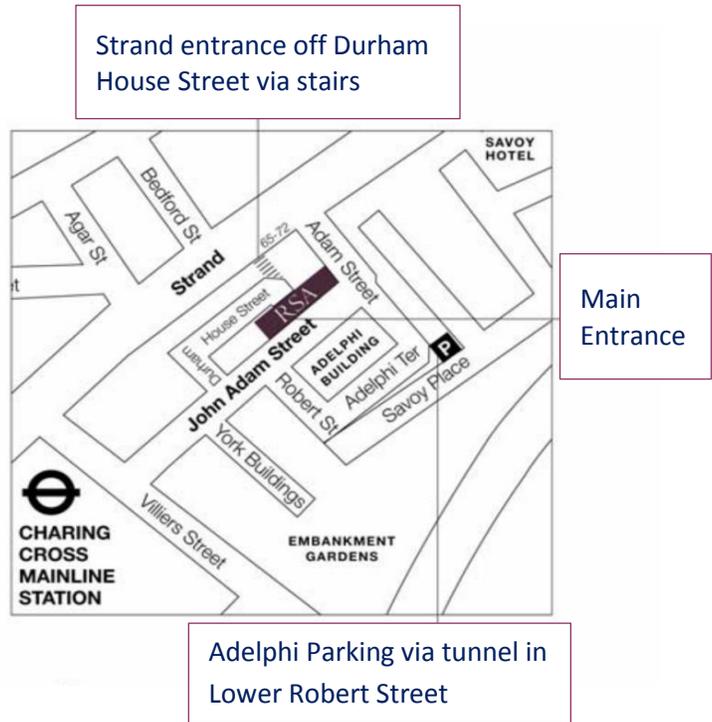
